




Scripture Lesson: Genesis 35:13-15, And God went up from him in the place where he talked with him. And Jacob set up a pillar in the place where he talked with him, even a pillar of stone: and he poured a drink offering thereon, and he poured oil thereon. And Jacob called the name of the place where God spoke with him, Bethel.

Jacob Poured out a “Drink Offering”

Genesis 35:14

Additional Scripture References - Numbers 15:1-5; 28:7-10

What Is A Drink Offering?

Jacob set up a pillar of stone in the place where he had talked with God. He first poured a drink offering of wine and then he poured oil over it.

— What is the significance of the drink offering?

The drink offering signifies Christ Himself as the One who was poured out before God as the real wine for His satisfaction. **Christ is the new wine.**




The Oil of Blessing at Bethel






Will you go to Bethel today and pour

4. A Poured-out Life is Holy unto God.






5. A Poured-out Life is Acceptable to God.

a **worshipful life.**






**Show the worth of Christ by

How Can I live a Better Poured-out Life Moving Forward?




