"Many go to church. Few go to worship."

Scripture Lesson: Ecclesiastes 5:1-7 (MSG)

Ecclesiastes 5:1-7 (MSG), Watch your step when you enter God's house. Enter to learn. That's far better than mindlessly offering a sacrifice, Doing more harm than good. Don't shoot off your mouth or speak before you think. Don't be too quick to tell God what you think He wants to hear.

God is in charge, not you—the less you speak, the better. Overwork makes for restless sleep. Overtalk shows you up as a fool. When you tell God you'll do something, do it—now. God takes no pleasure in foolish drivel. Vow it, then do it. Far better not to vow in the first place than to vow and not pay up.

Don't let your mouth make a total sinner of you. When called to account, you won't get by with. "Sorry, I didn't mean it." Why risk provoking God to angry retaliation? But against all illusion and fantasy and empty talk. There's always this rock foundation: **Fear God!**

The Preparation of Worship

Lesson Two



Genuine worship requires preparation.

Exodus 3:5, Remove the sandals from your feet, for the place on which you are standing is holy ground.

I. Preparation for Worship Requires Watching Your Step.



Do not come to worship God half-awake and stumble your way through worship and then stumble out.

No one can afford to allow their relationship with God to be a casual thing. It is to be the single most important thing in your life.

God must be treated as holy by all who draw near to Him.

We can't afford to worship casually. Enter God's house ready to hear and ready to learn.

As you enter the house of God, keep your ears open and your mouth shut. (Eccl. 5:1 NLT).

Psalm 145:18, The LORD is near to all who call upon Him, to all who call upon Him in truth.

II. Preparation for Worship Requires Watching Your Mouth.



Ecclesiastes 5:2, Be not unwise with your mouth and let not your heart be quick to say anything before God, because God is in heaven, and you are on the earth--so let not the number of your words be great.

Ecclesiastes 5:2, Do not be quick to speak, and do not be hasty in your heart to utter a word before God. After all, God is in heaven, and you are on earth. So let your words be few.

Proverbs 10:19, When words are many, sin is unavoidable, but he who restrains his lips is wise.

Matthew 15:8-9, This people honor Me with their lips, but their heart is far away from Me. But in vain do they worship Me, teaching as doctrines the precepts of men.

We Must Learn to Avoid Careless Praying.

Matthew 6:7, And when you pray, do not use vain repetitions as the heathen do. For they think that they will be heard for their many words.

Luke 18:10-13, "Two men went up to the temple to pray, one a Pharisee and the other a tax collector. The Pharisee stood by himself and prayed: 'God, I thank you that I am not like other people—robbers, evildoers, adulterers—or even like this tax collector. I fast twice a week and give a tenth of all I get.' But the tax collector stood at a distance. He would not even look up to heaven, but beat his breast and said, 'God, have mercy on me, a sinner.'

When You Approach God, Mean What You Say to Him.

Careless words reflect the inner life; for it is the heart that speaks forth a word.

Ecclesiastes 5:4-5, When you make a vow to God, don't delay fulfilling it, because He does not delight in fools. Fulfill what you vow. Better that you do not vow than that you vow and not fulfill it.

Learn to take God Seriously.

For many dreams bring futility, so do many words. Therefore, fear God (Eccl. 5:7).

"The more you know, the more you appreciate."

God doesn't just want you to worship Him; He wants you to know why you worship Him.

"If God is small enough for us to understand, He isn't big enough for us to worship."
